Paula de Elia, an architect who graduated from FADU UBA, opened her studio in 2001 focused on both architecture and design. She mainly develops project and construction management of offices, hotels, showrooms, homes and equipment design in Argentina and several Latin American countries.

Among her clients are Mercado Libre, Despegar, Motorola, Campari, IRSA, Bain & Co and Google. In addition to private homes, Elia's work for Solace, in Chile, stands out; and the Kalpakian Hnos. showroom, in Buenos Aires.

In 2019 she joined the board of Consultatio S.A. Real Estate, she participated in several editions of Casa FOA, where she received distinctions on several occasions, in addition to other exhibitions.

"We have very diverse projects: houses, offices, showrooms, hotels and we continue to work in association with several architecture studios. Everything is enhanced. In addition to interior design, we carry out architectural projects from the beginning," she says, adding that the studio has a product design division. "We operate in several disciplines, our profession requires teamwork, essential and necessary for our projects to materialize."

Among the multiple awards (International Property, IIDA, International Award Design and Architizer), she was several times among the first Interior Designer studios in the ARQ Ranking. This year she is in third place.



"I understand the distinction due to the result of quality work that we have been able to sustain over time, seeking excellence and showing our identity through a recognizable seal. It is a very important award because it is the result of the recognition of colleagues, construction companies, suppliers, which means fundamental support. A distinction is always an inspiration and a requirement to continue improving," she defines Elia.

This year's balance is very positive: "We work on several projects of various scales and themes, which allows us to cover architecture from many approaches."

Some of them include collaborations in the design of common areas of buildings developed by large studios.
